Executive Director's Message

Why we need Rainbow Services -

It is hard to pick up a newspaper or turn on the news without hearing another story about domestic violence. It is extremely pervasive in our society. Statistics, like 1 in 3 women in this country will experience some form of domestic violence, do not begin to tell the whole story about its impact on our society.



It isn is just the battered woman who feel the effects of family violence. 60% to 70% of those coming to Rainbow for help are children, who are often the unseen victims. Other family members are also often traumatized by domestic violence. Many victims are cut off from their families as this can be a method used by a batterer to maintain control over their partner. Employers often have to deal with the fall-out of violence in an employee home, as victims frequently have higher absentee rates, higher medical expenses and violent spouses can pose a threat to co-workers.

Even after all these years of advocating on behalf of victims, the issue is still one surrounded by shame. Women suffering at home may not let anyone around them know. One reason for this is that some people want to believe that domestic violence is something that happens **l**over there**l**. This just isn**l**true.

So, when you support Rainbow Services, you just may be helping your neighbor or a family member without even knowing it. No matter what, when you support Rainbow, you are helping to end a vicious cycle and quite possibly helping to save a life.
